Music Notes - Laudate Dominum is excerpted from a larger work entitled *Vesperae solennes de confessore* (Solemn Vespers for a Confessor). It was originally scored for a small orchestra and written by Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart in 1780. It was first performed at the Salzburg Cathedral as part of a vespers service.

Lord, Jesus Christ is also excerpted from a larger work. Samuel Barber wrote Prayers of Kierkeggard, a sacred cantata, over a period of 12 years. It was premiered on December 3, 1954 by the Boston Symphony, the Cecilia Society Chorus and Leontyne Price singing the soprano role.
